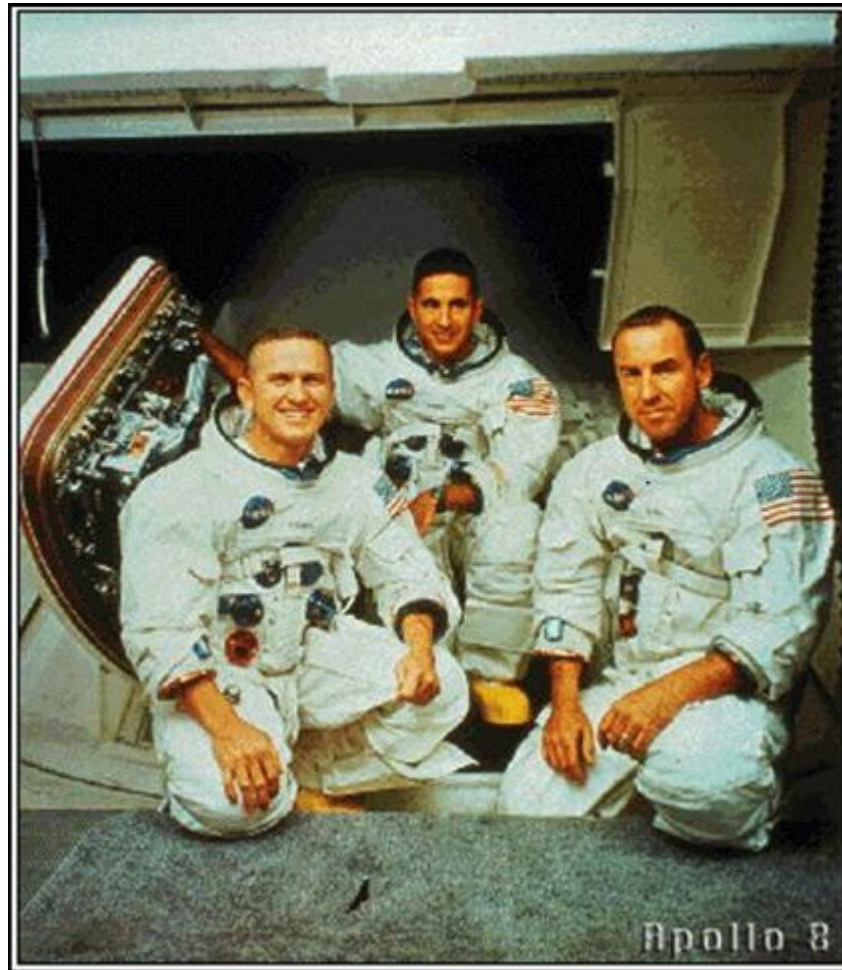

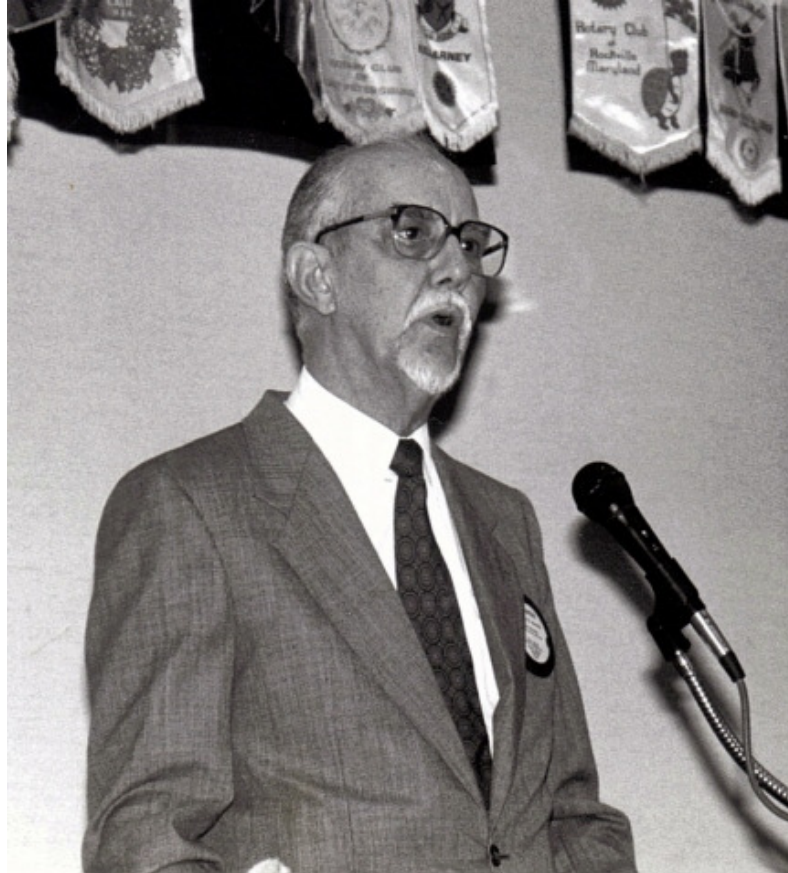

Clear View teacher is awarded Rotary's Teacher of the Year

The Space City Rotary Club named Clair M. Taylor, a reading teacher for at-risk students at Clear View High School, "Teacher of the Year," Monday.

Taylor, who has been a teacher for 27 years, was one of 75 Clear Creek Independent School District teachers nominated for the first annual award.

The field was narrowed to six finalists earlier this month, Jerry Smith head of the selection committee, said.

The five finalists are Kay Baxter of Clear Creek Intermediate, Sandy King of Webster Intermediate,

Karen Sue Lofland of Clear Creek High School, Mary Eunice Turberville of McWhirter Elementary and Sally Wall of Webster Intermediate.

Taylor received a plaque for herself, one for her school and a perpetual plaque for the district office. Taylor was made an honorary Rotarian, received a Paul Harris Fellowship and a check for \$1,000.

Taylor specializes in teaching older students to read. At Clear View, she works with students who are not motivated to learn. A full 70 percent of her students graduate and she covers an average of 1.8 grade levels per year. Her at-risk program is the only one of its kind in the state.

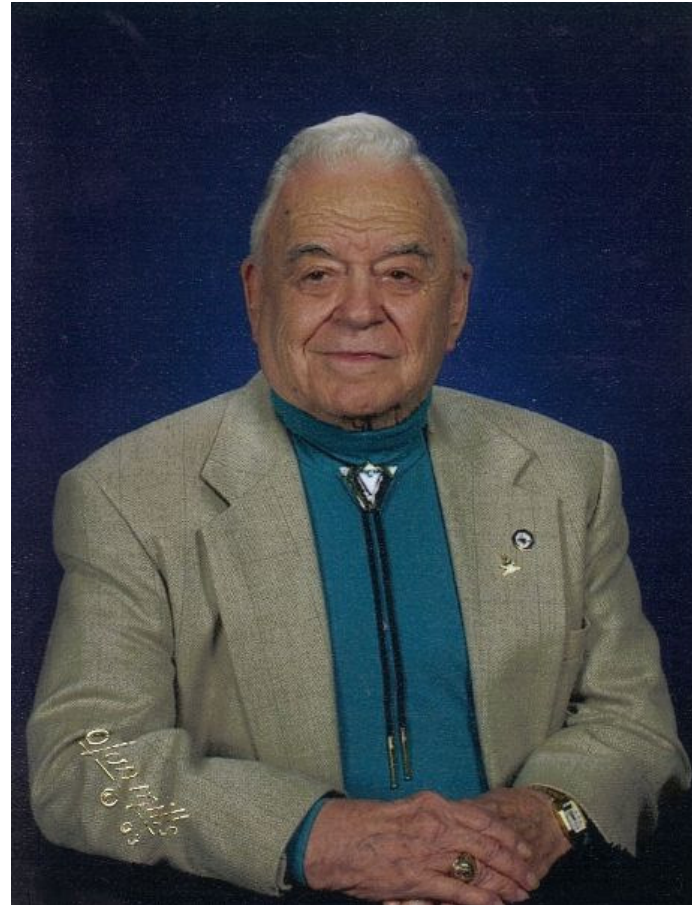
