

Meeting Notes October 6th—

- A check in the amount of \$1,000 was presented to Gregg Smith, Superintendent, for the CCISD Foundation.
- State Representative Rob Eissler, Chr. Public Education, presented the program regarding the work of The Texas Select Committee on Public School Accountability (TSCPSA). Several CCISD administrative heads and board Trustees were present. These are some highlights:
- There are 4.6 million students in public schools in Texas.
- Texas has teacher organizations, not unions, and they have motivations similar to parents. There is no collective bargaining.
- Schools are compared and rated based on their success in educating students.
- According to TSCPSA, there is a need for better data which is more accurate, consistent across school districts and made available timely so that schools can measure the success of their programs and make adjustments as necessary.
- The legislature and school districts need better tools to convert data into actionable information; to integrate academic and financial accountability; to rank results to identify relative performance; to identify areas requiring improvement and to monitor the progress of improvement strategies.




