Malaria kills more than one million people per year; 90% of them are African children. Malaria is caused by parasites spread from person to person through the bites of infected mosquitoes.



Dr. Brenda Hallyer, incoming Chanchellor of San Jacinto College (May '09) was the speaker and the following are highlights from her PowerPoint presentation:

- San Jacinto College is 47 years old.
- It serves 6 independent school districts.
- It is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Universities.
- There are 24,810 students enrolled for the Fall '08 semester.
- San Jac offers 44 academic programs & 140 technical programs.
- Its Clear Horizons College High School program allows high school students to takes courses and receive dual credit toward their high school diploma and a college degree.
- 42% of San Jac's adjunct instructors are employed in industry, thereby bringing today's skills and experiences to the classroom.
- In May '08 the district passed \$295 million in bonds to update facilities.
- The average age of a student at San Jac is 28.
