S. from Texas A & M University in electrical engineering and received his M. S. and Ph. D. in electrical engineering from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Joining him in presenting the program was Issa Z. Dadoush, P. E. Director of the City of Houston Building Services Department. Mr. Dadoush is a professional engineer with a B. S. from the University of Houston in engineering technology, with an emphasis in structural analysis and design. He also earned an Executive Masters Degree in Business Administration from the University of Houston. The title to the program was "Houston's Path Toward Sustainable Growth. - 7. Embracing renewable energy resources (Note: Houston is #1 in the nation in renewable energy
- 8. Purchases (EPA ranking)
- 9. Goal to plant more than a million trees
- 10. Diversion of waste from area landfills
- 11. Improve air quality
- 12. Ensure a quality water supply for the region
