#### A note from the Editor:

When I volunteered for the job of Editor of The Blastoff, I thought I could make a difference, and I still think that is possible, but not yet accomplished. It has long been my belief that a newsletter should be newsworthy. When The Blastoff was being distributed in written form at the meetings, my position was that if it could be read at the meeting and left on the table as trash, it did not contain enough news. I still believe that, but now that distribution is via email, I don't receive the feedback which my predecessors did when they observed the number of copies that did not leave the meeting with the members in attendance. In short, I only know if you have read an issue, if you make a comment to me, often in the form of noting an error. No offense is taken. I like to know that you read the issue closely enough to notice the error and care enough to bring it to my attention for correction in the next issue.

I believe now, eighteen months into the job, that there have been some accomplishments, but much remains to be done. As Rotarians, we have several sources of Rotary information, including The Rotarian Magazine, the RI website, the District website, the club website, announcements from the podium at meetings and our newsletter. I want to strive not to make the newsletter too redundant of the others, but knowing that members will not read all, there will from time to time be some overlapping, if for no other reason than to call your attention to the source for more in depth coverage.

With this issue, I am removing some things that have been repeated in most if not all previous issues, to-wit:

- the meeting agenda. Only members (and some previous members) receive the newsletter and we all know the agenda. It doesn't change from meeting to meeting.
- the motto. We are not Rotarians if we cannot recite the Service Above Self motto.
- the 4-way test. We recite this at every meeting and have pledged to live by it. Surely, we do not need to see it in print every week. If you can't remember it, snip a copy from a previous issue and put it in your wallet, purse, etc. to pull out when necessary.
- the convenient make-up clubs. Ditto the suggestion re: the 4-way test.
- the Shrimporee sponsor list. I think the list is appropriate and beneficial recognition in the issues between July 1st and the event, but afterwards, not so much. Because of our pledge to the sponsors, the business card ads will continue through June 30th, but I hope the Shrimporee committee will revisit this commitment for the next year. They take several pages to publish, tremendously increase the file size and upload time and, unless some news is mixed in with them, I doubt you are looking at them each week.
- Since this is a "newsletter," **it should contain news**; something that you don't already know or about which you don't need to be reminded. This is an easy statement to make, but has been very difficult to accomplish. Several attempts have been made to bring you what I consider the news, e.g., a suggestion that the President submit a monthly (or more frequent) note or article; reports from the directors concerning the activities of the committees for which they are responsible; monthly treasurer's report of how our money is being used; a brief rendition of the minutes of board meetings; sunshine & showers from members (good news & bad news you wish to share); letters to the editor or comments from members; to name a few. None have produced fruit and I don't know where else the news resides. Your suggestions have been solicited, but only a few have been received. What do you want to see in the newsletter? Do you want a newsletter? Is it necessary or just a tradition? Do you agree with email as the manner of distribution? Would you rather receive it in print at the meeting? Currently, there is no budget for printing, mailing, etc. Do you think there should be? Your email response would be appreciated and oh, so easy. This is your newsletter, not mine. There were several years in the distant past that The Blastoff was recognized at District Conference as the best newsletter in the District, but if there is still such recognition, I am certain we would not win; but we could.

With a wish for a prosperous, successful and happy new year, this is submitted for your consideration.
