MARCH IS LITERACY MONTH

Did you know ---

- For many in South Africa, literacy is a luxury.
- Children learn basic reading in school, but some never have the chance to read for fun.
- Many families have no books at home.
- 13% of people over 15 are illiterate.
- 9 years ago, two RI District Governors Elect, Ted Pope of District 9300 and Charlie Clemmons (Seabrook Rotary Club) of District 5890, launched the *Bury Me in Books* campaign to promote literacy.
- Since then, Rotary clubs in Texas have collected and shipped close to 9,000,000 books & donated hundreds of thousands of dollars to cover shipping costs to Durban.
- The literacy initiative is run through RI District 9300 Humanitarian Distribution and Service Center in Bedfordview, South Africa.
- Books are sorted and stacked by Rotary volunteers, and schools collect needed materials.
- "Today's readers are tomorrow's leaders," says Robin Bath, chair of the initiative. "Rotarians are shipping the books to South Africa, Post Net (the shipping company) is responsible for their delivery to South Africa."
- Due to publicity offered by South African Broadcasting Corp, thousands of requests for books have been received.
- The oldest caller was a 74-year-old woman.

Do you believe that literacy is only a problem of other countries, not the U. S.? Read "How our literacy stacks up beginning on page 26 of the March issue of the *Rotarian*. You may be surprised to find that the U. S., at one time the most literate country in the world, now ranks somewhere between 12th and 24th. Surprised? Astonished? This article, in fact, the entire magazine should be read!

THE GATES WAY TO A POLIO-FREE WORLD. "On the eve of accelerating his financial commitment, Bill Gates went to see for himself how eradication is working at ground zero in India. While his neighbors in a quiet, leafy suburb of Seattle elected the next U. S. president, Microsoft founder, Bill Gates, walked the dirt roads of a slum in India, where he too is working for change. During a trip in early November, the co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation visited Seemapuri, outside of Delhi, with health officials to witness polio eradication in India, one of four countries where the wild poliovirus persists. "It's amazing what a large task this is.," he told reporter in India. "Despite the challenges, I'm more convinced than ever that India will lead the way to the successful eradication of polio." You can read the rest of this article beginning on page 44 of the Rotarian magazine, March issue.

On its 50th anniversary, joining pioneer heroes in the early battle against polio, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jonas Salk & Albert Sabin, Rotary was inducted into the Polio Hall of Fame. Rotary International, along with the World Health Organization, the U. S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNICEF, have been working since the 1980's to eliminate the crippling disease and are pushing to eradicate polio in the four countries in which it remains endemic.

Shui-Sen Hsu (92 years young), a member of the Rotary Club of Taipei Northwest with more than 40 years of service, and his wife, **Pei-Tsen**, have been recognized for their US\$1 million donation to fight Polio.
