PAST PROGRAMS....On May 3rd, JOHN WATSON introduced MR. FRANK H. NEWNAM, JR. of the Houston Metro Planning Commission who discussed the master transportation plan for Houston and Harris County. Some of the statistics concerning the amount of traffic on Houston streets were really staggering. Mr. Newnam stated that the goal of the plan was to reduce the amount of traffic on Houston streets back to the 1970 level by the building of rapid transit systems, more counterflow lanes for buses and vans, and the addition of more overpasses to speed up the flow of traffic. He said that the cost of the total plan was in the billions but that motorists would save that much money by reducing the time spent getting to work. The major change for the Clear Lake area would be an overpass over the railroad and Highway 3 in Webster to speed up the flow of traffic on NASA Road One. Then on May 10th, DR. ALFRED NEUMANN introduced DR. KLAUS VON BISMARCK, of the Goethe Institute in West Germany. Dr. Bismarck gave a very interesting talk on the cultural exchange between West Germany and the United States as well as the political situation in East Europe. He had some very interesting remarks on the current situation in Poland and why the Communists were reacting as they have in that country.
