For only the second time in 22 years we honor one of our own active members as the recipient of Rotary's Distinguished Citizen Award. **ERWIN HEINEN** joins a select group of distinguished Houstonians who have given of themselves to promote the growth and betterment of our community, state and nation.

Erwin has been in the forefront of many community enterprises and has made substantial contributions of his time and talents to numerous educational, civic, cultural and social organizations and programs.

Besides his family and church, Rotary is probably his first love — but he is not one dimensional. He has served as an officer and Board member of the Houston Grand Opera, Houston Symphony Society, Society for the Performing Arts, Music Guild, Museum of Fine Arts, Houston Chamber of Commerce — just to name a form

Additionally, he has served as a Board member of the Harris County Hospital District, United Way, Better Business Bureau, etc. From 1974-1977 he was a member of the School Board, serving as

president in 1977. He also served as Chairman of the Board of the Houston Community College in 1976.


In Rotary, he has been a member since 1951 having never missed a meeting in those 34 years. Erwin was President in 1963-64 and went on to become District Governor in 1970-71. He has been active in every phase of Rotary — no job is too small or too big for Erwin. If it needs to be done and done right — all roads lead to Erwin Heinen's door.

A retired CPA, he began his career with Ernst & Ernst (now Ernst & Whinney) in 1927 and retired 42 years later in 1969. He served as Resident Partner from 1948 until 1960.

Erwin was born in the pleasant German community of Comfort, Texas, north of San Antonio. He and his wife, the former Emily Plummer, have two married children, Nancy Luetge and Dr. Hubert Heinen. They are blessed with five grandchildren. He received a BBA degree from the University of Texas in 1927.
