



Let's make 100% attendance a habit! You know, it is your personal responsibility to keep up your attendance. No one is going to personally nursemaid you. But we do want you here.


IF YOU CAN'T MAKEUP DON'T MIBD

drop from 3375 to 3340. A major effort to upgrade the facilities will begin in 1986 with restoration, maintenance and modification funds receiving a 25% funding increase. In 1987, the Center will undertake construction of two entirely new facilities.

Mr. Getz noted that NASA and JSC are in a transitional period in which the agency is receiving many new management challenges. They are being asked to manage two major programs at one time, Shuttle and Space Station, without a comparable increase in budget. They also have the additional efforts to consolidate their operations into fewer contracts, transfer some functions to Kennedy Space Center and reorganize internally to effectively manage the Space Station. Mr. Getz concluded by highlighting the Space Shuttle missions that will be upcoming in 1986.
