

PROGRAM NOTES

MEETING OF JUNE 9: Mr. Alan Kiepper was the guest speaker at our weekly luncheon. Mr. Kiepper is the manager of the Houston Metropolitan Transit Authority. He provided us with a dramatic overview of the improvements that have been made in the Metro bus service in the last four years. improvements are refflected in the following statistics: Maintenance (from 513 miles between road calls to 9200); Accidents per 100,000 miles (9.2 accidents to 2.5); On-time performance (39% to 97.2%); and costs per revenue mile (\$5.29 to \$3.29). Mr. Kiepper was introduced by Rotarian Merv Hughes.

MEETING OF JUNE 16: The program this week was presented by Mr. Dick Petit, the Director of Plans in the Aviation Dept. of the City of Houston. Mr. Petit, who was assisted by Tina Ceppi, was introduced by Rotarian Don Kirk and presented an overview of the construction plans for our three airports. This included Intercontinental, Hobby, and Ellington Airports. Of Intercontinental, he spoke of the new east-west runway that will give them a parallel operation capability. They are also to constriuct a new international terminal and additional cargo ramps. For Hobby, plans include a new traffic entrance that will enable a better flow of traffic. Several runways are also due reconditioning. Of Ellington, he pointed out that things are just getting underway. However, the first general aviation servicing facility has recently begun operations. The master plan is still under development. Mr. Petit also spoke of the extensive network of heliports that the city is planning.


