

MEETINO OF NOVEMBER 10: Rotarian David King introduced the program for this week. His guest was Dr. Mike Mize of Mize Consulting Associates. Mize is a professional counselor who spoke on the transitional phases of men's lives. He outlined four distinct phases of men's adult lives and focused on the transition to the middle years (i.e., beyond 40). He spoke of the psychological and emotional changes that are taking place during this transition. The transition period normally takes about 5 years and is filled with inner turmoil. The transitional period between 40-45 is commonly known as the mid-life crisis. He pointed out that men in the middle adult years are characterized by their greatest period of contributing to their community, their thinking processes are the most capable and their ability to express themselves is at its best. Biologically, men are at their peak, with the exception that their recovery period from the expenditure of energy is longer. These characteristics seem to explain to some degree the participation in civic clubs such as Rotary. It also made me think maybe there are a few good years left.
