



THE NEW AND THE NOT-SO-NEW


DO YOU KNOW THESE MEMBERS?

Al Brady. Al has been with the club for the last 18 years. He is just about as retired as a person can get. He was a fighter pilot in WW II, was recalled for Korea, where he flew missions in that arena, and decided to stay on with the service for the remainder of his military commitment for retirement. ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE

Rotary International strives to foster world peace and understanding through youth exchange. One exchange program is now available to Space Center Rotary wharaby out children, ages 15–18, can live abroad in Rotary-supervised homes while attending a year of high school. The graduated senior can also live abroad the year after high school but must attend school in the foreign country, even if not fluent in the language.

The student will live with four families in the same school district, changing homes every three months, with a Rotary counselor in charge all year long. Rotary will provide \$80-100 in local currency; living expenses are provided by the family or Rotary; and the student's financial obligation will be to purchase round-trip air fare, medical insurance, aand wardrobe.

There are dozens of countries which participate and the student has a preference. The students are selected for this honor based on their academic and social skills, and their ability to be an ambassador of good will and fellowship for our country.

In addition, Space Center Rotary Club is looking for four families in the Clear Creek or Clear Lake school district who would like to <u>host a foreign student</u> for three months as our part of this exchange program. When we have four families lined up we will offer to accept a student for a year.

TRAUELING IN 1987?

To prevent "TD", chew 2 Pepto Bismol tablets 4 times a day (with meals and bedtime), beginning the day before you leave through 2 days after your return. This is safe and usually effective. Before your trip, count your need and buy ample. They are not expensive. ---One more suggestion: no ice or picante sauce. Good Luck!

(*Ed. Note: Other risks can also be reduced by removing the bottle before ingesting contents.)


BASHFUL BOZE

FROM THE GOVERNOR'S NEWSLETTER

A TOUCHING ROTARY STORY

Tom Cobb, Secretary of the Humble -Intercontinental club sent in this report.

"A woman had called you, Governor Walt, telling of her need for glasses. She had no money and her glasses frames were broken and had been glued together several times. Finally, the glue wouldn't hold any more. She had noticed a Rotary sign in a store asking for used glasses to be donated. (Even though our club has a glasses project, the sign wasn't ours.)"

"I happened to be downtown the same day, so on the way back I stopped at her trailer home on the Aldine Mail Route. I found the whole family present - a husband, 25, wife 24, three children and another on the way."

"There was no food in the house and her husband told me he had a job at a fast food store working six hours a

night, five days a week. However, he hadn't been paid yet. I gave them what money I had to buy food and milk for the kids, which were cute and clean children. The Humble Rotary club quickly arranged for an eye examination and glasses, thanks to the generosity of Rotarian Mike Mann, an optometrist."

"The mother picked up her glasses last Thursday. It was then discovered that her daughter, age 5, was practically blind. I learned that if I had the same sight I wouldn't have been able to find my car keys. The little girl received her glasses this week."

"The club has also advanced \$100 as a loan, to be repaid, to help the family with the rent."

"We know this kind of story takes place all the time all over the world, thanks to Rotary, but it gives you a lift to be part of a simple event like this. Two people who were blind, now can see."
