MAY 18, 1987 PERSONAL

□ 50% of 9th graders never graduate from high school.

- D 25% of high school graduates leave as functional illiterates.
- ☐ The average prison inmate has a 7th-9th grade education.
- □ Illegal drug trade is a \$110 billion industry in the USA.
- Illegal drug activity is gravitating to Houston for many of the same reasons that it gravitated to Miami-- the seaport and long coastline, the large immigrant population, and proximity to Latin American sources of cocaine and marihuana.
- A 1983 study shows that crime is down but fear is up. The HPD has responded with programs that increase the visibility and citizen contact of police officers.

MEETING OF MAY 11: Sonny Nichols, Polio Plus Chairman for District 589 reported that our district has raised \$235,000 toward its \$850,000 goal-- good progress for our first year.

Jim McNatt urged us to fill out our committee preference sheets and get our committees in gear so we will be prepared when District Governor Al Bussey visits (now scheduled for July 20).

Lamar Bowles filled us in on the Reverse Draw scheduled for June 19th at the Nassau Bay Hilton. Everyone is on a team and has tickets to sell: \$30 blue tickets, which include the buffet and free drinks and \$100 buff-colored tickets that also give you a shot at the \$10,000 grand prize.

Al Ligrani reminded golfers of the weekend at Columbia Lakes June 26-28.

Sam Marullo presented a \$1000 check from the club's Trade and Free Enterprise Committee to Pete Atha, Vice President of Marketing, Junior Achievement of S.E. Texas. Junior Achievement Director of Development Michelle Ventura presented a program and film on Junior Achievement, including remarks by Michelle Moore of Barrios Technology, a volunteer in the applied Economics Program in the Clear Creek District.

Junior Achievement's primary activity in the Bay Area is the teaching of a module led by volunteers like Michell Moore, in which senior high economics classes play computer simulation—games that teach them how to maximize profit through decision making related to production, marketing, etc.
