# MEETING NOTES: adapted from notes by Steve Bolton

AUG. 10: Don Kirk auctioned off a set of nesting Russian dolls (from the Tsar to Yeltsin) that Joe Hang bought in Russia and donated for the benefit of the Space Center Rotary Club Endowment Foundation. High bid was by a visiting Rotarian. George Fleming introduced Larry Mathis, President and CEO of the Methodist Hospital System, largest private hospital in the U.S. and third largest caregiver for cancer. Larry Mathis pointed out the tough choices that face us on health care. HEALTH CARE IS NO LONGER LINKED TO ECONOMIC REALITY! 80% of U.S. has access to health care they want but aren't paying for it. There is a feeling that everyone should be entitled to unlimited care at someone else's expense. He emphasized that HEALTH PROBLEMS IN THIS COUNTRY ARE NOT THE RESULT OF SHORTCOMINGS IN THE HEALTH CARE AVAILABLE BUT ARE THE RESULT OF POOR PERSONAL CHOICES IN LIFESTYLES (smoking, alcohol, sex, drugs, nutrition) AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS. (He also remarked that 60% of malpractice awards go to lawyers, encouraging suits and increasing the cost of health care.)

AUG. 17: New member Alba e' Sanchez, mother of a current foreign exchange student we are sponsoring, was introduced by Karen Birchenough. ---Jack Fryday of the Seabrook Rotary Club (we sponsored them) ceremoniously returned the \$2000 we had loaned them to finance their first fund raiser. That's the way to establish good credit, Jack! ---Bob Wren announced a new "IOU" plan that members can use to attend the Ray Graham benefit. Last chance to take advantage!

Floyd ("keep your seats") Boze introduced our speaker, District Governor Bob Ellis and his wife Leanna. Governor Bob gave us an inspirational and entertaining talk, including illustrations of his points with his "little red pump". Some notables: You must prime the pump! (you have to put something in to get something out)! Any project worth doing will require reasonable effort. When you stop a project, you have to start over. If you pump long enough and hard enough, you can succeed. Plus, our club can be as great as its dominant inspiration! You can be successful if you make enough other people successful! And of course, there's no such thing as a free lunch (other than the one he had just eaten!) ---It was a good time, capped by Terry's presentation to Bob and Leanna of a beautiful framed space photo of the earth.




