

ITEMS FROM OUR BOARD MEETING

District Gov.-Elect Billy Weseman has asked our club to host the district assembly for training (i.e. run the show, not pay for it) with about 300 to attend. Terry Hesson will get more information before a decision is made. -- The club's service budget for '92-'93, after projecting expenditures and income, faces an \$18,000 deficit if executed as proposed. Some budget cuts will be required and a special meeting of the directors over service committees will be called to review the budget figures. If the directors involved cannot get the budget slashed, the executive committee will make the necessary cuts. -- Bill Lowes reported that the <u>luncheon food format</u> is being reviewed and that the hotel is receptive to the idea of a one meal "expanded salad bar" at one price. This will be resolved soon. -- Jack Lister was appointed as chairman of the nominating committee for the club election coming up in December. Candidates were being chosen at press time.

SPACE CENTER ROTARYS PAUL HARRIS SUSTAINING MEMBERS

(A communiqué from Al Brady and Hal Neely)

In April 1988 the Space Center Rotary Club, in an stimulate effort to participation in the Paul Harris Sustaining Member program, contributed to the Rotary International Foundation an amount of money equal to \$100 for each member of the club who at that time was not a Paul Harris Fellow or a Paul Harris Sustaining Member. The money was designated to be credited to the opening of a Paul Harris Sustaining Membership account in the name of each of the specific individuals. Many of these individuals are no longer members of this club and there are others who are still members but have not made additional any contribution to their Sustaining Membership account. In both cases the accounts are inactive. The committee is in the process of surveying these individuals as to their future Sustaining Account plans.

It is a "no pressure" survey. But if anyone who was a previously designated recipient does not. anticipate contributions at present or in the foreseeable future, then that person is asked to consider releasing the designation so that a re- designation can be made to provide matching funds for someone else who does wish to participate. This request is being presented to both current members and former members. Between the two groups there is a potential to put to more active use nearly \$10,000, a sum that could also be matched by new contributions thereby implemented.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Many of you may remember the series of commentaries that I did under this title between my first stint as editor of the Blastoff and my current go at it. It has become quite popular to write on the theme of encouraging people to make a difference, even articles in national publications. I'm sure I didn't start it but I am still at it. My articles were written in recognition of the outstanding (even heroic?) work by many of our members, work of conception and execution that made a difference in our community. Work that made our club not just good but outstanding!

We have a lot of new members since then. Many of you who are new may not have yet felt the pull of the harness or even know how to get hitched up to our 40-plus committees system. Here are some thoughts.

<u>First</u>, decide that you, personally, are going to do something to make a difference in the work of this club with the help of the Rotary fellowship.

Next, pick a program of the club that you would enjoy supporting. It's like when you choose a career: If you don't like it, you are not going to be very good at it. Also, you will find that some of the many committees only meet occasionally (if at all?) while others are at it constantly. Those with a program that runs all year will endear Rotary to you much more quickly.

<u>Third</u>, immerse yourself in the work of the committee. Contact the chairman. Volunteer (if you can bring yourself to say that word). Ask questions- about the committee's scope, organization, membership, what you can do. Suggest possible new ideas. Attend meetings. Help when you are asked. Service in Rotary is the path to new friendships and fellowship.

If the list of committees is not on the Bulletin Board, ask for it.



Presently serving as Parliamentarian, President of Board of Trustees of Endowment Foundation, and Director of RNASA Foundation. At District level: served on GSE France planning and selection committee and Gov.'s Representative for Gov. Fitts Presently, Chrmn. of District 5890 Community Service Comm. Married to Linda Claire, 8 children and stepchildren (3 marines) and 6 grandchildren. (Ed. note: Wait a minute! We have the same number of grandchildren but he got his doctorate 27 years after I got mine and his BS 19 years after I got mine? I have a feeling there is something humorous about that but I'm not sure! Either he's too young or I'm too old, or both.) His hobbies are computers, photography and flying stunt kites at the beach.

George Fleming of Flagstaff AZ became a Texan when he was transferred to Ellington AFB in 1942 as a Pilot Instructor. George had joined Rotary in Arizona in 1940 where he taught before serving in the Army Air Force as a Captain, Pilot Instructor at Ellington, Carswell and Randolph AF Bases.

George attended Arizona State U., U. of Southern California, and U. of Houston and earned BA, Masters and Doctorate degrees. George had an active career in hospital administration, serving as Personnel Director, VA Hospital, Houston; Chief Executive, Mainland Hospital, Texas City; Associate Administrator, Methodist Hospital, Houston; Chief Executive, Santa Rosa Medical Center, San Antonio; San Jacinto Methodist Hospital, Baytown; and retired from Methodist Hospital, Houston in 1988. George has been recognized for his activities: Past Chairman of Texas Hospital Association and recipient of Collier Award, Distinguished Hospital Administrator-1985; Life Fellow American College Health Executives; Boy Scouts of America Silver Beaver Award-1967; St. George Award-1968.

A Paul Harris Fellow, George has been a Rotarian for 33 years in six different clubs and president of Baytown and La Marque clubs. George has been married to Elaine Rogers Fleming, M.D. for the past eight years and has two children: George, a lawyer, and Scott, a businessman, both in Houston. He has 3 grandchildren.
