


A "Thank You" from the Wiers



Reports by Huey Barnett and Bill Geissler are outlined on another page.-- Michelle Jowid became the newest club member continuing a long tradition in the Jowid family's participation in Space Center Rotary.

Lynette Hale introduced Virginia Lang, Executive Director of Business Volunteers for the Arts. She explained how the volunteers are selected and what they do, as well as how business The organization helps. provides a mechanism for businesses to provide business expertise to arts and cultural organizations with the intent of promoting the development of Houston's cultural base. At the same time it fosters sound business principles for arts organizations to operate more effectively. Business skills are taught for application in "non-conventional settina". A conduit is developed for flow of information between business and the arts.

Excellence in Law Enforcement Committee- Dr. David Taylor
This program, another brainchild of Dr. David Taylor, is patterned after

special effort is being made to educate the applicants and agencies in the
characteristics that we are focusing on.

Career Development Committee- Jim Harlan

Jim Harlan has just assumed the chairmanship of this committee and is establishing its goals and objectives.


<u>Bill Geissler</u> reported for the International Service B committee: International Youth- Karen Birchenough


Aeropuerto Club Relations- Gonzalo Montova

MEMBERS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Selma Neumann, native of northern New York State, is a graduate of the U. of Mich. School of Music with a Masters Degree in Piano Performance. She has had a very enriched life with her husband of 38 years, the late Alfred R. Neumann, Founding Chancellor of the University of Houston Clear Lake. After he was medically discharged from the service in 1946, he taught at Tulane 2 years. Then to Harvard to teach and work on his Ph. D., after which followed U. of Mich., where Selma taught piano until Alfred became her dean. After he became Founding Chancellor of UHCL, they moved to Seabrook while UH was under construction.

As First Lady of UHCL, Selma helped establish a town-gown relationship between the university and townspeople. Continuing Houston activities and new ones here, she founded the Bay Area Houston Symphony League. Until her husband's death in 1983, they traveled internationally extensively, often with their two children who are now grown professionals in Houston. Selma joined Rotary in 1990, served twice on Teacher Award and Shrimporee Committees.

Frank Morgan has been in Rotary so long that you may think you know all about him. But here is the real scoop. Starting in the dark ages, he graduated from Georgia Tech with a Bachelor of Aeronautical Engineering degree then received a Master of Science degree from North Carolina State. Frank inlisted in the Navy in early 1943 and is presently a retired Lieutenant Commander. ---He is married to the former Jean Roberts Holt and together they have five grown children who are scattered all over the world.

Frank joined McDonnell Aircraft Company in 1957 and established the McDonnell Douglas Corporate office in Houston in January 1962.
