# RNASA HONORS TOM STAFFORD

One of the offsprings from Space Center Rotary, the Rotary National Award for Space Achievement (RNASA), honored former astronaut Tom Stafford at its banquet and executive forum at the Hyatt Regency in Houston on Feb. 18. Aerospace executives from around the nation came for the black tie event.

Stafford was awarded the National Space Trophy while four others received Stellar Awards for career space contributions, notably: Peter Wilhelm, Director of the Naval Center for Space Technology; Dr. Roger Bilstein, professor of history at UHCL for his work in aerospace history; Charles Caughren, site director for Rockwell's Orbiter Assembly and Test Operations; and Otto Goetz, manager of the Space Shuttle Main Engine Office at Marshall Space Flight Center.

This annual event established itself with a national audience from the first year it was held. The group of Space Center Rotarians that developed this award program deserve much admiration.

Mike Porterfield, Director for Club Service A, covered Attendance (Vince Lipovsky, chair) that continues the battle to keep us filling our attendance duty; Constitution and By Laws (Billy Ray Smith, chair and parliamentarian) keeping us legal; Fellowship (Bill Taylor, chair) promoting participation in our recreational and social activities; Golf (Dennis Dillon, chair) which promotes both fellowship and fundraising; and Shrimporee (Bill Taylor, chair) which is being analyzed for a new format to reach for greater accomplishment.

Joe Hang, Director for Club Service B, covered Program (Vann Jones, chair) that asks the entire membership to be alert to any truly outstanding programs that they may hear of for our meetings; Blastoff (Tom Wier, editor) with its search for reportorial help as well as a new editor to meet Tom Wier's request for replacement; Roster/Directory (Maggie Adams, chair) that has an update scheduled to go to press at the end of March and beseeches you to provide information where incorrect or incomplete- A DO IT NOW MATTER!; Public Relations (Eddie Janek, chair) now seeking to produce a tri-fold brochure to publicize Space Center Rotary to all the community; and the Telephone committee (Bob Montgomery, chair) that functions in emergency needs for communication to the membership.

MORE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Vic Maria announced several important dates (which have been incorporated into the events calendar on the front page of this Blastoff). LaWann Tull told us it was time to get in applications for candidates for short term summer exchange, a wonderful experience for youth. Pete Zamora called attention to the information on the five outstanding law enforcement individuals being honored (and which were detailed in the last Blastoff). This is a great new program of our club. Past District Governor Tyler Baker presented a show on Goodwill Industries.

3/1 MTG. Speaker for this meeting was Bill Read of the U.S. Weather Service who brought us lessons learned from Hurricane Andrew In Florida. Some of his points: Andrew was a Class 4 storm with Carla (1961) being the last Class 4 storm to hit in our area. Alicia was a minimum Class 3 storm. Planes, ships, and even buoys are now included as sources of storm progress information. The time to evacuate the area is when the landfall prediction is 72 hours and location is predicted anywhere from Louisiana to One mistake the public makes: "Don't worry. The Corpus Christi. government will take care of me." Texas policy does not order evacuation, only recommends. So it comes down to your decision. Florida policy, on the other hand, includes an ordered evacuation. Bill Read says "Make the decisions NOW as to what actions you will take. Don't wait until you have to take action." That includes your choice of evacuation route, what emergency equipment you will take, and whether you can get it all in your vehicle. New Doppler radar here now can accurately show detail from New Orleans to Brownsville. ADVICE: Pay attention to the leading "onset of hurricane conditions" edge location, NOT where the "eve" is in judging when you will be in trouble.
