

Interact and Rotary: A Winning Combination

The Interact committee is dedicated to supporting leadership development among stir local high school students. The committee provides guidance to established high school clubs (over seven years of continual service) at Clear Lake and Clear View High Schools. The clubs are structured similarly to Rotary clubs. Each club has a school sponsor who works with the Interact committee and the student club. Each interact club elects officers and a board. Projects are developed and approved by the officers and board. A committee chairperson is assigned and given responsibility for the project. The chairperson develops and implements a project schedule with the assistance of the school sponsor and Rotarian Interact committee. The sponsor and the Interact committee attend and support all meetings and projects of each club. The school sponsor ensures the club's service activities follow school policy and is the single point of contract for all school related issues. Through the success or failure of the club's projects the students develop communication, leadership, and teamwork skills. It is the responsibility of the sponsoring Retary club to provide opportunities and facilitate the development of participating young adults. The Interact clubs are service clubs that reflect their sponsoring Rotary club. Our local interact clubs have supported many of Space Center Rotary's activities including Shrimporee, Pancake breakfasts, and Spagnetti dinners. They have also raised and contributed \$2000 over must three years to local charities through their own projects. These projects have included Battle of the Bands, Miss Daisy Day, Habitat for Humanity. Candy Drive, Car washes and many others. The students that pass through the Interact doorway gain confidence in themselves and the capabilities that they develop during their relationship with Rotary. Many later become Rotarians. All move on with the realization that "Service above Self' is rewarding.
