





Rotary districts from New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas, Kentucky, Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee, and Alabama are members of this multi district organization whose purpose is to promote and improve the Rotary Youth Exchange program. The leadership is like unto Rotary - a president, president elect, secretary, treasurer, training officer, and two members at large serving on the board.

SCRYE strives to meet the goals of Rotary Youth Exchange in improving world understanding and making the world a better place through our youth. SCRYE conducts two meetings each year to provide training to those who attend. This year, the summer meeting will be July 29, 30 and will be hosted by our district at the Hobby Airport Hilton Hotel.

Rotarians from the 10-member states attend the two SCRYE meetings each year. Some have been involved in RYE for years and have a wealth of knowledge through their many experiences. These Rotarians serve as trainers for the meetings. Others come to learn. Everyone gains from the sharing of knowledge and from the many new friendships that are gained through Rotary.

From PDG John Painter's July #12 issue of Pointedly Painter

The Retary year 1999-2000 has certainly been an exciting experience for the Dove and I. We set our goals and prepared our great District organization to take on these goals seriously and make a difference in our world around us.

This year we added one Rotaract club being sponsored by the Rotary Club of Gulfway/Hobby. We added two Interact clubs sponsored by Sweeney and North Shore. We sponsored three Ambassador Scholars. We hosted two GSE teams and exchanged two with Romania and Brazil. We had 54 clubs obtain the Presidential Citation and by doing so this act strengthened the clubs. This was again 100% of the District achieving this goal.

Our goal for Polio Plus was \$50,000 and we raised \$51,165. Our goal for members net in the District was a 75 member increase. Records are not clear but it appears we have a conflict with sexual numbers increased. Charlie's member status from polling the clubs is about a 40 member increase.

Our Matching Grant goal was 4 clubs participating but we actually have initiated twelve during the year. This is an outstanding amount of involvement by this District.

Our Youth Exchange program was very successful and you can see Alan Wylie's article in this newsletter for a summary.

We hosted several Russians sponsored by the Library of Congress and Rotary. We will be doing the same Charlie's year. This time judges, two groups of five each.

We had an excellent increase in Benefactors this year. I am sware of at least 40. The District only had 20 prior to this.

The ruffle goal was \$360,000. We fell short on this number but we did ruise \$315,851.71 unrestricted funds. This is not the final number as TRF lags behind 60 days. This number grows each time we ask them how much. The total amount of funds ruised for TRF both restricted and non-restricted is \$531,635.67 and growing. This is an outstanding amount and you are to be congrutulated. See the tabulation sheet as to how your club faired in relation to per capita giving.

Our District Conference was a huge success. Our goal was 650 attendoes. We didn't make it but we did have 554 registered. By the way, it looked like it too. What we didn't do in quantity we made up in quality. You may take note of the RJ President's Award for our conference. This was a first and it was really deserved by all.

One of our goals was to strengthen all existing programs and clubs. This was the least spoken of but the most important of all. Our RI President, Carlo Ravizza, set the tone for this. It struck home with his Governor's 2000. His unpublished theme was Governor's 2000,

2 - 0 - 0 - 0 and as everyone knows I have a bad hearing problem and thought he said GO! GO! Well we get going and really raised the level of activity in all programs. This is the single most one accomplishment we saw this year that we are the most proud of.

President Carlo Ravizza shock the foundation columns of Rotary. He was like President Harry Truman in my opinion. He will go down in history as one of the great presidents in Rotary but will not be recognized as such at this moment.

The other accomplishment that is not spoken of is the District's finances and the status thereof. We were able to bring all funds under a blanket of our 501-C3 status and actually doubled our balance in the District general fund. This gives our new Governor a good cushion and statning place as well as not increasing the District dues this coming your and gives us a better handle as to actually what we need and/or have.

The Dove and I have had a wonderful time as your Governor for the year 1999-2000. My paronts always taught me that if I borrowed something, to always return it as I received it or a little better if I could. We hope we returned our wonderful opportunity to serve as it was given to us.
