Incoming District Governor Dennis D. Adams

Then his job took him to other areas of the company which included extensive world wide travels, dealing with oil tool industry in the safety, health, and insurance and product liability area. He served as leader of Junior Achievement and represented his company with the Chamber of Commerce and United Fund.

He is a professional member of ASSE, he spent three years on the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Steer Auction Committee, has been a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Shrine for 28 years, he has served as board member and president of a private Christian school which his son attended and was involved in career day at Memorial High School.

He began Denny's Electrical Service as a part time business and realized that was his interest and Denny's Electrical Service became his full time job. He is also an Electrical Inspector in the City of Hunters Creek Village and Piney Point Village and has been for the last 24 years. 
