
## JAMES CAMPBELL HOUSTON CHRONICLE EDITORIAL STAFF

#### THE RUSSIANS ARE HERE

We are happy to have as our guests today a delegation of Russian Dental professionals. The team is composed of eleven members, a group leader or facilitator and a professional interpreter. They will be in the Houston area for the remainder of this week.

The team is traveling under a program sponsored by the U.S. Department of State which brings young entrepreneurs from Russia to study our business practices. They then apply what they have learned to their businesses when they return to Russia. The program is like a modern day Marshall Plan. The effect is to help rebuild a sound middle class based on a market economy.

The program is called the Productivity Enhancement Program and is administered by the Center for Citizen Initiatives, a San Francisco based non-profit organization. The visit of this particular delegation began in January with the help of PDG Jon Eiche, acting as the Local Coordinator for the group. This is a joint project of the five Rotary Clubs in Ft. Bend County: the Rotary Clubs of Sugar Land, Ft. Bend County, Rosenberg, Richmond and Oyster Creek. Each of the clubs has played an active role in securing home hosts and visits to various dental facilities in the Houston Metro area. The business visits have been coordinated by PDG Bob Ellis, a retired dentist.

During their two week visit, the team has been given presentations by the U.T. Dental School, the Ft. Bend Dental Society, the Texas School of Business, and dental clinics and dental equipment companies in the various specialty areas of dentistry. The group has had presentations on strategic and business planning, marketing, running a successful practice, an overview of American Dentistry, management decision making, financial planning, personnel management, current trends in dental surgery, associations and lobbying, business ethics, and the education and certification of Dentists and Dental Assistants.

The team has also been the guest of several Rotary Clubs in District 5890 and two fundraisers. This visit is an excellent example of the Rotary Vocational Lane of Service in action.
