

FRANK LOUIS CURTIS, for member of Space Center Rotary Club, died July 24, 2007. Some biographical information:

- born on January 9, 1924 in New York City
- · served from 1942 thru 1947 in the U. S. Navy as an aircraft mechanic and flight crewman
- graduate of the Illinois Institute of Technology, class of 1951
- B. S. degree in Industrial Engineering
- worked for The Boeing Company for 37 years starting out as a flight test engineer
- held a number of positions including: Systems Engineering, Test Manager, Reliability and Safety Manager, Omaha Office Manager, and Safeguard Test Target System Manager
- appointed Shuttle Carrier Aircraft Program Manager in 1975
- assumed Management of Boeing Houston Operations supporting the Johnson Space Center on the Space Shuttle Program
- 1983 appointed Vice President, Business Development of Boeing Services International (BSI) located in Cocoa Beach, Florida
- 1985selected as Program Manager, Air Force One, which consisted of modifying two 747 aircraft for use by the President of the United States
- active in the University Baptist Church of Clear Lake City
- survived by his wife Shirley of 22 years, three Daughters and several grandchildren and great grandchildren

A fifth Immunization Event sponsored by SCRC was held August 2nd at the Interfaith Caring Ministries in League City. The funding for these events is a continuation of SCRC Blane Grant award. This event exhausted all remaining funds. The following SCRC Rotarians, Junius Fox, Laura Godwin, Jennifer Keller and her son Louis Adler, a nursing student, assisted nurses and screening and educational staff to provide over 60 immunizations to special needs children. This local project eminated an International presence with all SCRC volunteers speaking Spanish with the families at this event. Jennifer Keller, RN serving as project lead met with representatives from Interfaith Caring Ministries (ICM) and the Galveston County Health District (GCHD) during the event and all unanimously concurred that the need exists for immunizing small children to support community health initiatives. Hepititis A is the most frequently administered serum to small children at this event that coincides with health department district wide statistics. The Hepatitis A serum was not available to offer to children until after 1995 and the health department is still finding school aged children who are not immunized. The Centers for Disease Control report that children ages 3 to 4 present a higher risk of acquiring Hepatitis A and this presents a higher risk to spreading this disease among immediate family members and our community at large especially since it is difficult to diagnosis this disease in small aged children. Another risk factor for acquiring Hepatitis A are among travelers coming from Mexico and other Central American countries where the highest reported cases of Hepatitis A exists. Our project targets both pre-schooled and school aged children up to 18 years of age. Representitives from GCHD, ICM and Jennifer Keller agreed that an aggressive outreach program targeting communities where families that immigrated from developing countries need to be educated on the importance to acquire immunizations and provide them with dates to when immunization events offering free immunizations will be held at ICM. ICM representative concur that 4 events per year is a minimum requirement. In addition, immunization co-pays have increased from \$5 per patient to an average of \$20 per patient placing a higher demand for funding. With our support, ICM will continue their outreach program that along with the Galveston County Health District, will provide more special needs children with the required immunization for disease prevention.
