

DISTRICT 5890 SEEKS ROTARIANS TO LEAD GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE (GSE) TEAMS TO FRANCE AND SOUTH KOREA IN SPRING 2008

Rotary International District 5890 seeks Rotarians to lead Group Study Exchange (GSE) teams to France or South Korea for four weeks in spring 2008. The exchanges are all-expense paid trips for 4-5 non-Rotarian young professionals, led by a Rotarian.

What is the GSE program?

The GSE program is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for young business and professional men and women between the ages of 25 and 40 and in the early years of their professional lives. For four weeks, team members experience the host country's institutions and ways of life, stay in host Rotarians' homes, observe their own vocations as practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

Responsibilities of the Team Leader

The team leader acts as advocate, confidant, mediator, organizer, intermediary, consultant, colleague, friend, motivator, arbitrator, and protector of team members. As the only Rotarian on the team, the team leader is expected to assume complete control of the team and put its interests first.

Eligibility Criteria

The team leader must:

- be an experienced Rotarian;
- remain with the team for the duration of the exchange;
