



### Environmental Awareness for Space Center Rotarians (Courtney Lindberg, Chair) Here are some easy tools for you to green yourself through sustainable practices:

### Save money and energy

Turn your air conditioning down or off when leaving the house to save money and energy. There has been debate about how long you have to be out of your house to warrant turning down the air; some say it takes as much energy to cool down a house after being out with the air off for extended periods of time than setting your air conditioning at a slightly warmer temperature than you have it set at while at home.

Here are some tips to remember about air conditioning:

- 1. If you are running errands and are in and out of the house all day, turn your air conditioning thermostat to 78 or higher. Estimates of savings from turning your air to 78 range around \$50 a month or more.
- 2. People arriving home from work in the 5-6 pm hour are coming home at the warmest part of the day and their house might take additional time to cool off. By setting thermostats above 80 and closing drapes, your house will stay much cooler during the day and require less a/c to cool it off upon your return.
- 3. If you are going to be out of your house for more than 8 hours or so (more than a full day of work) then shutting your air conditioning off would be a good idea.

We can all be more forward thinking and extend the influence of these ideas to our daily lives. We can all tote a refillable bottle around instead of filling the landfill with plastic. Packing lightly when we fly not only saves jet fuel, but our backs too. Unplugging items not only saves energy, but can avert a fire safety issue also.

#### 40th Anniversary of Apollo 11's Placement of First Man on the Moon

On July 20 1969, the Apollo 11 crew Neil Armstrong, Commander; Michael Collins, command module pilot; and "Buzz" Aldrin, lunar module pilot, succeeded in setting the lunar lander on the moon. Armstrong's historic words, "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." will resonate forever.
