Dear Rotarians:

Thank you for your generous check of \$500.00. Thank you also for allowing me to share with you what our Pantry is doing to feed the hungry in Clear Lake and surrounding areas.

Each morning that we are open, hungry people begin lining up at about 5:30 a.m., and by the time we open at 8:00 a.m. there is a long line stretching down the sidewalk. Many come with babies and small children.

God is enabling us to distribute food and other items to over 300 families each week – recently we served 161 families in one day at our Pantry building in Clear Lake. In 2008 we provided food to 20,982 families (if counted every time they received food), and our numbers this year have more than doubled, with 4 times as many new families. Besides distribution through our Clear Lake location, last year we helped 28 other ministries, including a battered women's shelter, a crisis pregnancy center, a homeless ministry, a camp for at-risk children, and a Hispanic ministry. After Hurricane Ike, we provided food to 2,330 people through Disaster Relief centers in Seabrook, Galveston, San Leon, League City and individual ministries. We were the first responders with food and clothing to San Leon, where many homes had 3 feet of water in them and some were completely destroyed.
