

"YOUR TWO CENTS WORTH." (part 6)

The Two Major Types of R.I Endowment Funds were discussed last time.

The money we invest in RI is returned through several plans.

- 1. Polio Plus. We already know much about this fund. In the year 2004-05, Rotary International expended \$33,000,000. Up until June 2005, \$581,000,000 had been expended toward global Polio eradication.
- 2. Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Fund. This fund is available for large projects of two or more years in duration. It is used to alleviate hunger and human suffering and to enhance health in general. The fund halted earlier, and is now back in force.
- 3. Matching Grants. These are used for International service projects. In 2004-2005, 136 countries benefited from awards amounting to \$25,800,000 District Simplified Grants. Districts use the grants for short-term projects of humanitarian content. These are targeted both for international and local projects.
- 4. Individual Grants. These are used to provide travel support to individuals involved in on-site project development or on-going overview. Since year 2003-2004, 87 countries were funded \$2,700,000. In the year 2004-2005, 372 grants were provided for a total of \$1,600,000.
- 5. Group Study Exchange (GSE). These awards are given annually for pairs of countries. Persons involved include a Rotary team leader and a team of non-Rotarians of varying vocational areas. Each team spends from four to six weeks in the country assigned, trading and learning from one another. Since 1965, 52,000 individuals (12,000 teams) from 102 countries have participated. In 2004-05, 404 teams traveled abroad benefiting from awards of \$3,000,000 to \$4,000,000.

These are a few of the grants available to Districts and Clubs. The money used for the grants listed above came from the dollars we invested in Rotary International Foundation. It should be clear now that we are able to accomplish many more and larger projects due to the granting process than we ever could from fund raising alone, an outstanding reason to become a Paul Harris Fellow.

Q. What types of membership are available in a Rotary club?
