Re: Project Free Enterprise Project Amigo Vocational Visitors

Dear Ms. Sohn:

Project Free Enterprise and Project Amigo are one in the same -- a visiting team of business people giving a two-day seminar on various aspects of starting and running small businesses. Project Free Enterprise went to Eastern Europe four different years after the fall of the Berlin Wall and gave seminars in 16 cities. It has discontinued because it hinges on an invitation from a hosting club willing and interested in organizing such seminars.

Project Amigo is the same seminar team idea but went to Mexico City and gave five seminars after the NAFTA legislation went into effect and there was a need for exploring common ground in the business model between the United States and Mexico. There also has not been a repeat of this project in recent times and I consider it to be expired as well. It hinges on host Mexican Rotarians who have not extended any further invitations.

These seminar teams could be beneficial for other countries but offers to bring them to Russia, for example, have not materialized. I think it is because the hosts have a big responsibility to find a meeting facility and to place the team of about 8 people in private homes for the duration. These projects typically lasted two weeks. You can delist them from your computer.

As for Vocational Visitors, I have not been involved with that this year and will need to defer to our District Governor John Painter. It is a project whereby a group of individuals who share the same vocation come to Houston to observe in the work place of their vocation. It was an offshoot of the seminar teams. We have hosted vocational visitors from Poland twice, Mexico, and twice from Russia.

Lately our district has been participating in other Russian initiatives and our own home grown idea of Vocational Visitors may not have been active. I will have to check on that. So if you can hold off on this particular project for further correspondence then I or our governor will advise you about it.

IDEA: Select individuals from a given society which would benefit their community, and not just themselves, by being exposed to the business ideas, expertise and practices of companies or individuals in their same vocation. For example, the owner of a day care facility may acquire ideas about how to better educate and care for children by observing other day care facility practices. This would benefit children at their own business, but would also introduce new ideas or standards into their community.

PURPOSE: World peace through understanding, and the sharing of knowledge and experience which in effect makes the world a global community.

METHODS: In general, a "Visitor" is selected and sponsored by a sending Rotary club which submits an application on the candidate. The district committee in Houston will review the vocational request and network the city to see if an appropriate agenda of participating businesses and host homes can be aligned.

TYPICAL VISIT: for one to three weeks, usually about 10 days. During the "work week", the "Visitor" would be taken to observe at 2 to 5 related businesses. Exactly what is planned can depend upon the vocational field. One business may be all there is available or is necessary. The number of host homes will likely be limited to one and maybe a second one on longer stays. Transportation will be arranged in combination with the host home, hosting businesses, and the hosting Rotary Club in that part of town. The social agenda will also be a collaboration of these hosts.

MULTIPLE INTERNS: are preferred. It's about as easy to make arrangements for up to three people as one. But they need to be following the same business intern work week. The number of people the host business will accommodate will be the most limiting factor. Transportation the second.

WHO QUALIFIES? Must be age 21, and in a position of ownership or management to be able to implement ideas. This is not for students. It is a post-educational internship-like visit to gain experience. It is open to non-Rotarians, Rotarians and their family.

HOW TO GET STARTED? Make a preliminary proposal from the sponsoring Rotary Club as to vocation, number of people and time frame to:


