



SCH Blane Grant Immunization with Interfaith Caring Ministries

A fourth Immunization Event sponsored by SCRC was held January 11th at the Interfaith Caring Ministries in League City. The funding for this event is a continuation of SCRC Blane Grant award. Jennifer Keller serving as project lead collaborated with Interfaith Caring Ministries and the Galveston County Health District for sponsoring these four events. The following SCRC Rotarians, Micki Czarnik, Bill Giesler and visiting Rotarian Ted Keller from Effingham Rotary Club, assisted nurses and screening and educational staff to provide 30 immunizations to special needs children. Two more immunization events are being planned for Summer '07. Based on our continued support, approximately 350 immunizations have been administered this year for special needs children. With our support, ICM will continue their outreach program that along with the Galveston County Health District, will provide more special needs children with the required immunization for disease prevention.
