

Donation Criteria

- Member must be in good standing with the Club.
- No Space Center Rotarian or family member is eligible.
- The recipient needs to have a significant need, or help in accomplishing a charitable activity. Examples are as follows: A person who has cancer, someone who's house burned down, or a person in REAL need, or an organization who is doing something innovative and worthy in charity.
- Only club members may make a nomination.
- The donation must meet the ethical standards of the Four Way Test.
- The donations cannot be applied to a building fund except for a specific need such as a rebuild of a person's home or business, and then perhaps a specific area of the rebuild.
- The donation must be definable to a specific need; that is no donation to an organization's general overhead expenses. However donation to a needed person's utility bill would be appropriate.
- The donation must meet the Objects of Rotary as noted below:
 - encourage Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards
 - undertake projects and activities to improve life in the Club's community
 - expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace
 - recognize the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, service projects, and exchange programs

Process

- The awards each Monday right after the regular meeting.
- The club member who made the nomination to make the award with as many other club members present as can make the trip.
