CAP" LANDOLT, AT 85, IS LOST TO US

Revered for his accomplishments, for his friendliness, and for his booming song leadership, Cap died suddenly at his home last week. The hushed singing of "Smile" at last Monday's meeting was a moving tribute.

Cap Landolt was with Rotary since 1939, and a member of Space Center Rotary for 14 years. He was president of 2 clubs, Uvalde and George West. He was the Master of Ceremonies for the 25th Anniversary of two Rotary clubs, attended 3 International Rotary meetings, visited Rotary clubs in London, Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Switzerland and Mexico, and leads our club in singing with his sliver-throated voice. He has worked with the Clear Creek Independent School District for 27 years in the past, where he held the position of Superintendent. He helped work with the original 7 astronauts in their relocation to Johnson Space Center. He has contributed a great deal to the community and has a street, a school, and a park named after him. He is truly the grand old man of Space Center Rotary.
