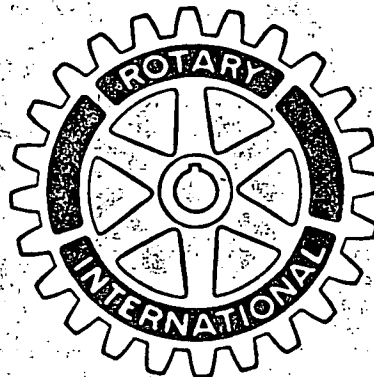
SPECIAL INVITATION

ALL-DISTRICT ACTIVITY

Our district has never had an event involving all clubs other than the district conference. One idea to increase club association and comradery would be a slow pitch softball tournament tailored to the qualifications of our Rotarians, but not drawn out and lengthy. Following are some suggestions and ideas:


1. Each club submit at least one team.
2. Each team furnish t-shirt, cap and glove.
3. Each team will have a limited number of practices before tournament play.
4. Each game will be 3,4 or 5 innings long, to speed up number of games, not endanger players and make for a speedy, lively tournament.
5. Emphasis will be on participation rather than winning, but winning will count.
6. Points can be awarded for number of Rotarians attending their club team's play, number of players, etc.
7. All sorts of prizes or awards can be given away.
8. Tournament should be handled from a district level. Slow pitch commissioner to be selected. There will be little expense. One weekend should complete the tournament.
9. Rotary Anns can sell sandwiches, cakes, bar-b-que, chili, etc. and contests and awards.
10. This could become an annual event with all sorts of side contests and activities. A real fun festival if the first one is successful.
11. The Memorial Park softball fields could be reserved for this one weekend tournament. Anybody can play slowpitch softball, regardless of age, etc. Again, participation is the keynote and the inter-club and intra-club fun can really be great, clean, and funny.
12. Revolving trophies or permanent trophies.
