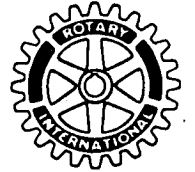

## ROTARY COMMITTEES AT WORK.....

COMMUNITY SERVICE.....Community service has been called the heartbeat of Rotary. It carries out the third part of the Object of Rotary, which encourages Rotarians to apply the Ideals of Service to their own neighborhoods. Further, through these acts of service, Rotary endeavors to develop the individual club member by enabling him "to find his place in the community and to serve in that place; and to cause him to consider his citizenship in its relation to the world, the nation, and the community."

FELLOWSHIP.....The next club fellowship time will be October 14th at Carlos's Beer Garden. This will be a good time to get your Rotary Committee together for a meeting. More details will be announced later.

INTERNATIONAL YOUTH.....The purpose of the International Youth Committee is to work with the American Field Service and other related organizations in support of foreign student exchange programs. Additionally, when requested we support the foreign students living in, or traveling through, our Rotary Club area. The Committee also will lend support to the Youth Exchange Committee in its goal of sending local youth abroad for a short term cultural exchange.

OCCUPATIONAL INFORMATION AND 4-WAY TEST. There is no more worldwide opportunity for Vocational Service than the early training of youth--the new generation of employees and leaders--to habits of right thinking and doing. What better accomplishment could we as Rotarians hope to achieve than a thorough job of persuading the young people of our community to use the 4-Way Test? Example is the best teacher.

SMALL BUSINESS COMMITTEE.....Next month we celebrate Vocational Service Week (10-16 October). Perhaps this Avenue of Service is the least understood of all four avenues. It has, for example, been called "that indefinable something." One Rotary club bulletin, however, looks at Vocational Service in a manner easy to understand: "Why man, it is your job! It is the food you eat, the clothes you wear...It is the way you help others dependent upon you... Vocational Service is the way you fit your job into your life and the lives of others around you.
