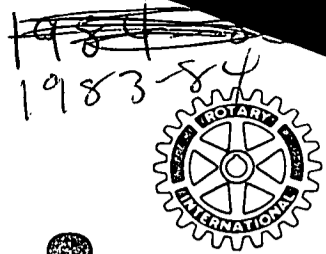

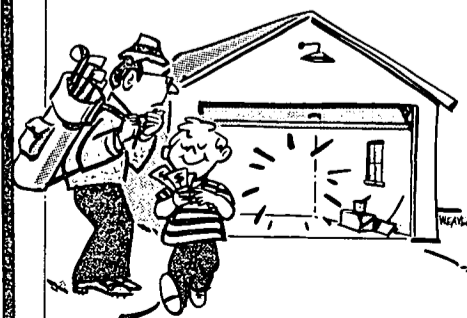
DUES! DUES! DUES! DUES! DUES! DUES! DUES! DUES!

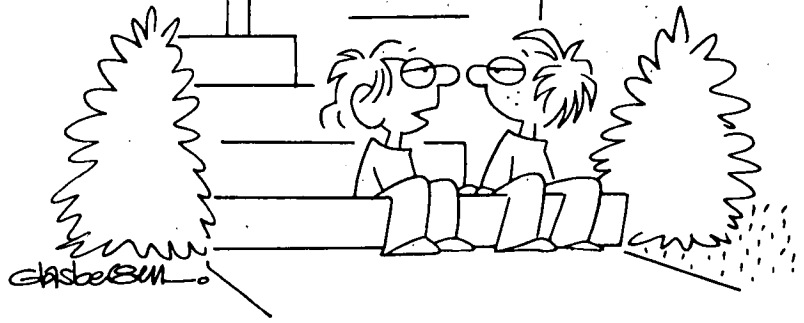

"I haven't done anything the rest of you haven't done," Hargrove said,

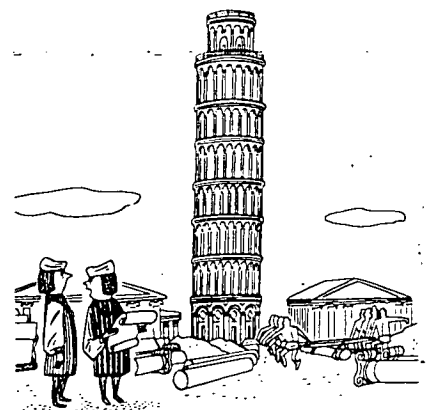
"really I don't deserve this. It's the nicest thing I've ever had."
