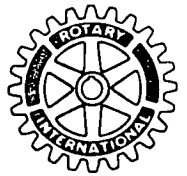

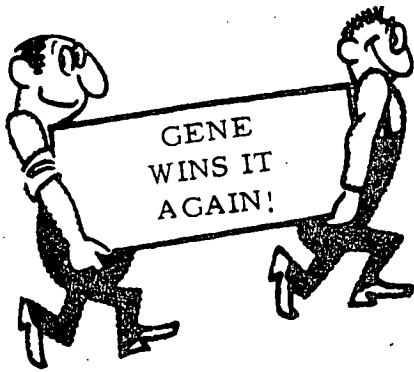

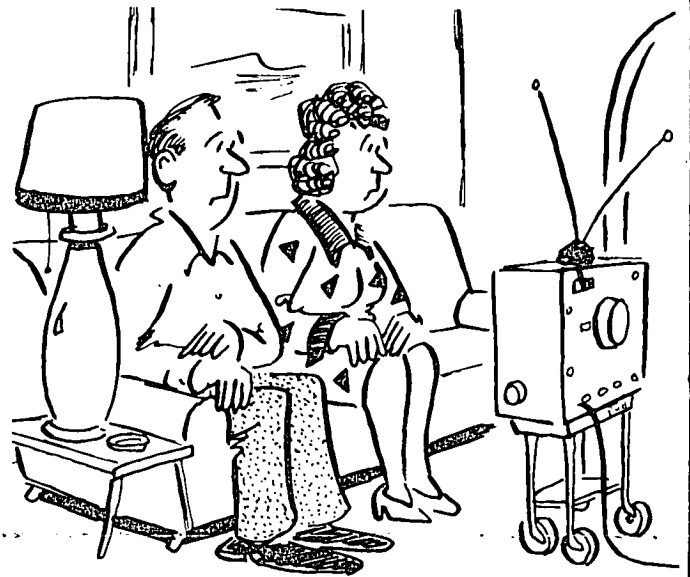

It was 60 below, but Doc Matheson hitched up his dogs, covered the 145-mile round trip, and had Shorty in the hospital in 18 hours. Both the patient's legs had to be amputated.


Shorty was a stranger in Fairbanks, yet an hour after his plight was known, the hat was passed for money to send him to the States for artificial legs. Almost everyone contributed. The collection totaled \$2,900, and Shorty was taken to Seattle.

The following summer, Fairbanks was having its Fourth of July Parade when a dusty little man with a back pack and a staff came tramping along the main street. It was Shorty. From the coast town of Valdez, he had walked the 400 wilderness miles to Fairbanks on his new legs!

Immediately after receiving a rousing welcome, he demanded a list of those who had contributed to his leg fund. "I came back to run my wood camp," he said, "and repay every man and woman who put in for me." But he never did find out who contributed. There wasn't a soul in Fairbanks who remembered giving anything toward the fund.
