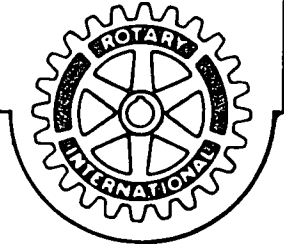

Our July 29 meeting will include a presentation on a new, exciting program being undertaken jointly by our club and St. John Hospital. The new program will provide free medical care for needy victims of disasters or those suffering disfigurement from congenital causes. The Rotary wives group has expressed a desire to work with us on this program. You are encouraged to bring your wife to what promises to be a very informative program.

MEETING OF JULY 1: Richard D. Stewart, Plant Manager, DuPont in La Porte, provided a motivational introduction to the need to control our hazardous wastes in Texas. He pointed out that we generate 250 million tons of waste every year, including a significant amount in each and every household. Mr. Stewart brought with him a movie entitled "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow", which is intended to educate the public on what industry is doing about the problem of hazardous wastes. The movie pointed out how we came to have this problem and what various forms of waste disposal are currently available to deal with the problem. Mr. Stewart, who has been on Gov. White's task force on hazardous waste disposal, discussed the various actions that the state and federal government are taking to deal with the toxic sites located throughout this area of Texas. He estimated that Harris County probably is among the 10 worst counties in the nation as far as the severity of our problem. *****

MEETING OF JULY 8: Anthony W. Hall, Jr., Houston City Councilman, was the speaker for this meeting, talking about the growth of the City of Houston. In earlier times there was fantastic growth; Houston was a boom town. But outside factors caused it to lose both its oil base and its Mexico trade. Now it has experienced a recession like the rest of the country. That has a good side because it makes it necessary to take a mature, longer term look at itself. It forces otherwise diverse elements of the community to work together. ---Barbara Ladoulis, Co-President of American Field Service for the area, also spoke briefly after being presented a \$1000 check by **Ted Wenglinski** on behalf of the International Youth Committee of Space Center Rotary. 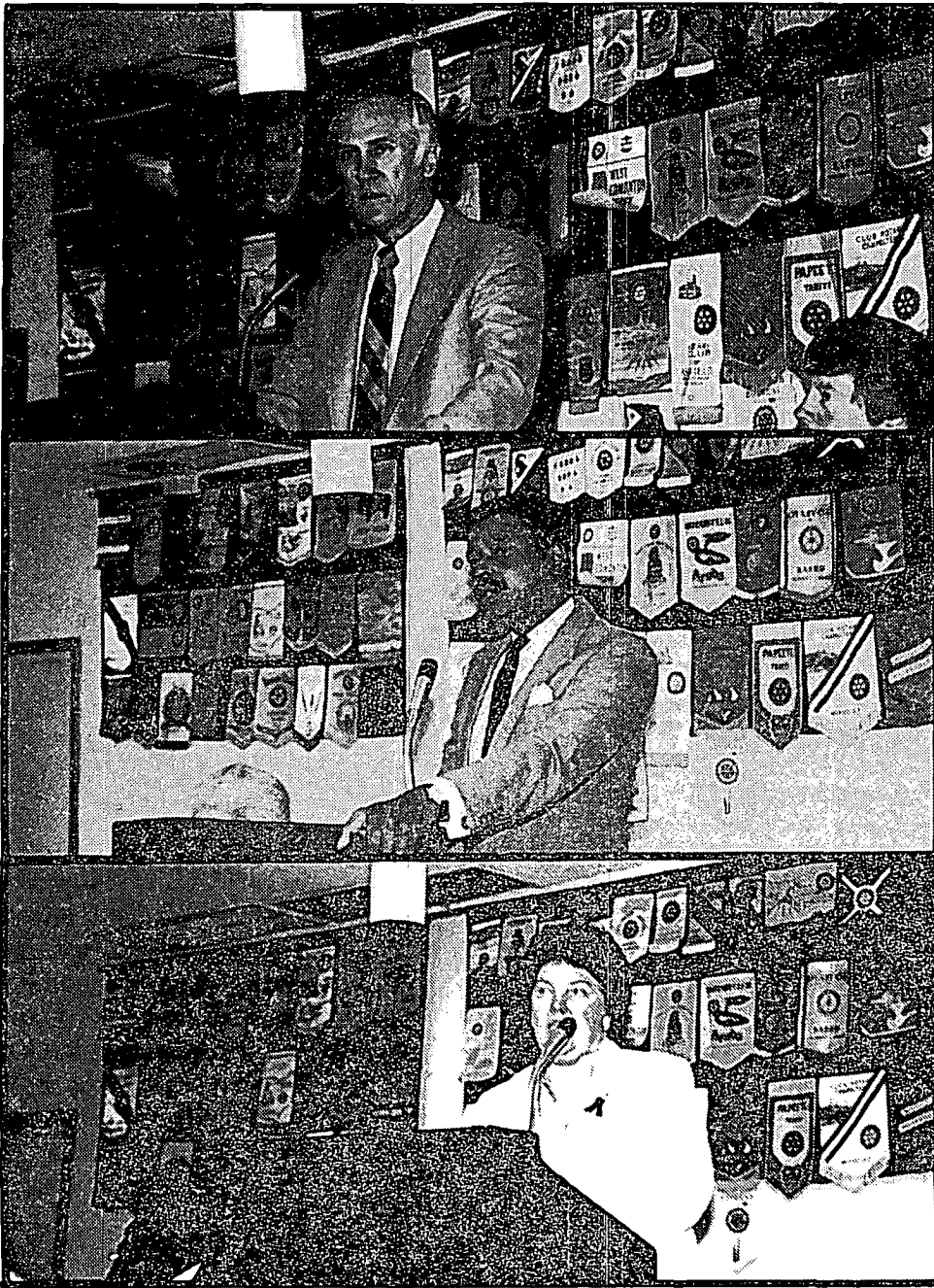

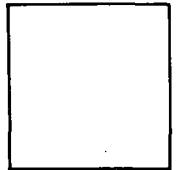
