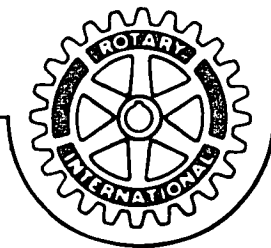

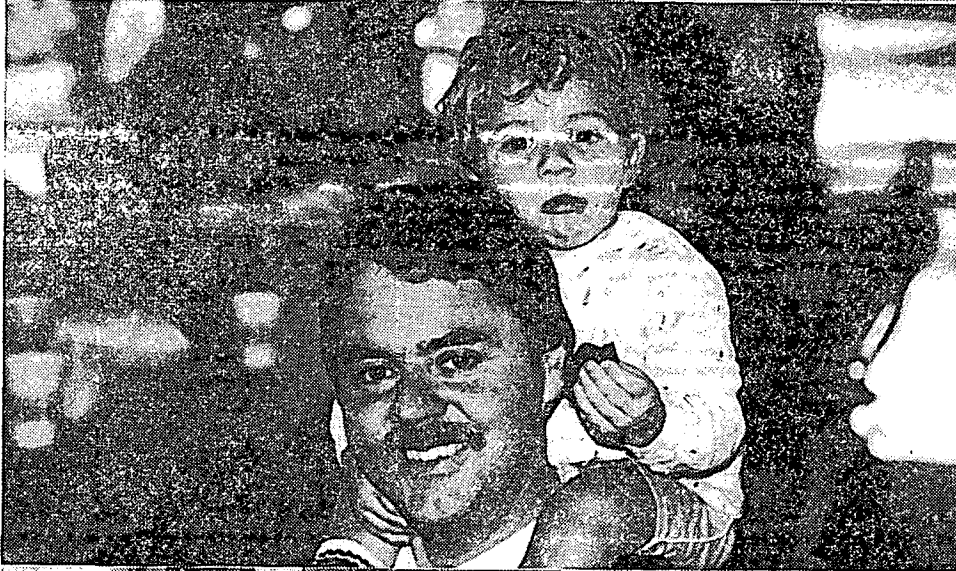

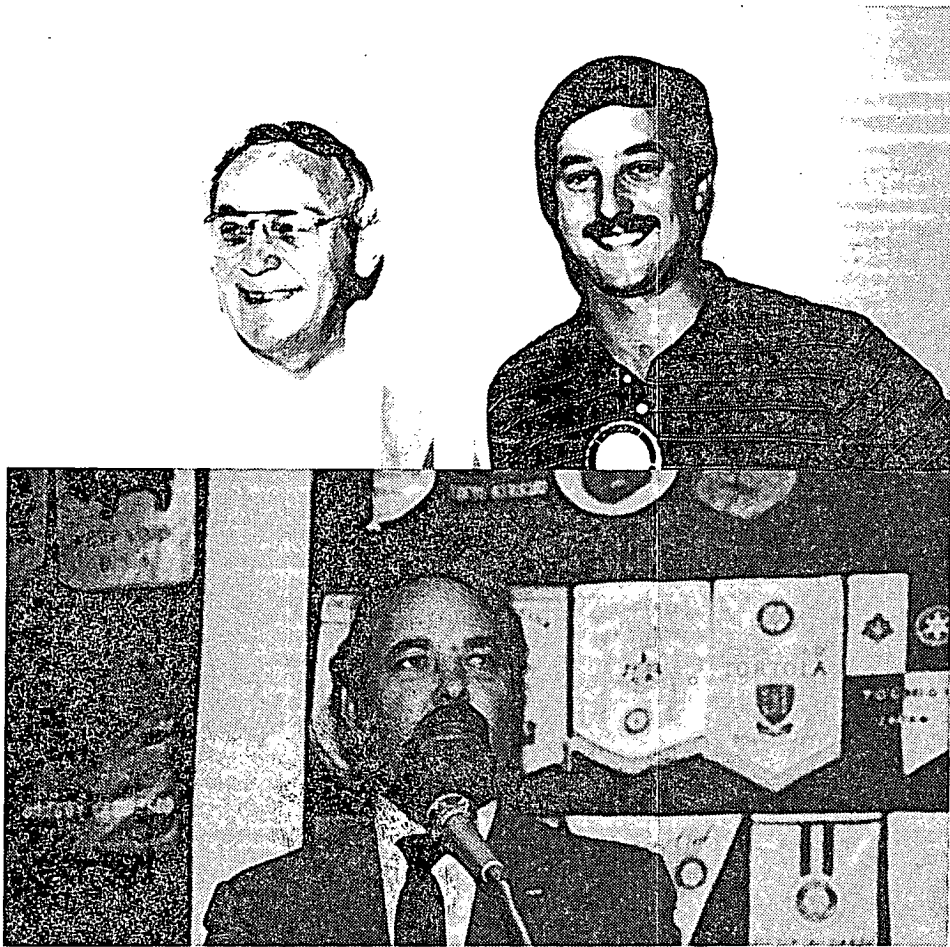
The Board accepted the resignation of **Tom Cummings** for business reasons. ++++++

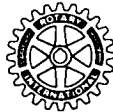

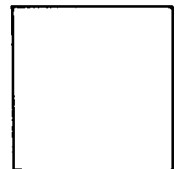
