

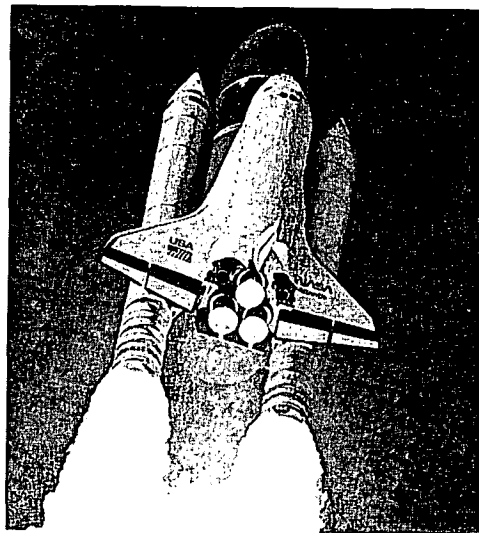

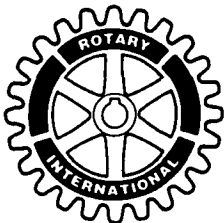

Rotary World Summary

Nelson Mandela, president of the Republic of South Africa, is the recipient of Rotary's highest honor, the 1997 Rotary Award for World Understanding.

Rotary International BOD opened the People's Republic of China and five Eastern European and Central Asia nations for Rotary extension.

Warring factions in Afghanistan agreed to observe "days of tranquillity" in early April and May, paving the way for the country's 3.6 million children under the age of 5 to be immunized against polio. It marked the first time national immunization days had been held in the Asian nation.

Reinforcing his belief that "helping the needy should be the first concern of those who strive for world peace," a Japanese Rotarian, Shiego Takayama and his wife, Megumi, gave \$1 million to the Rotary Foundation's Permanent Fund.
